Limited Warranty

Coverage


The Limited Warranty covers the frame, shell, door and components for 1 year, a 10 year warranty on the door seal from the time of original purchase from an authorised dealer by the original buyer. If, during, this period a covered component fails, Oasis Hydrotherapy Systems Ltd will provide a replacement part to the owner through an authorized dealer. Shipping charges and all other incidental costs are not included. Oasis Hydrotherapy Systems Ltd will not pay labour costs involved in diagnostic, removal, repair, service or replacement of the parts. All warranty claims must be coordinated through and authorised dealer.

Limitations

The Limited Warranty does not cover defects, damage or failure caused by the shipment, delivery, installation or user, including and not limited too: Modification of any type for any reason, electrical or water connections not specified by the installation and specifications included with the unit, improper installation, unreasonable operation, accident, neglect, lack of proper routine maintenance, or acts of god, including, earthquakes, floods, lightning, etc. The finish's warranty does not apply to fading, cracking, delaminating or blistering due to excessive wear, sun fading or souring due to cleaning.

Parts

When warranty parts are required, contact your authorised dealer. Be prepared to supply proof of purchase.



For everyday cleaning, a soft cloth with mild soap and water is all you need. Always rinse after cleaning. DO NOT use scouring pads or abrasive/caustic cleansers.

Vinegar and water may also be used to soften water minerals. To disinfect, use bleach diluted with water to sanitize.

Water Jetted Tubs

Regularly disinfect to ensure water jetting system stays clean.

Safe Use Of Your Air Massage Bathtub

Your physiological response to a hot massage bath depends on your age, health and medical history. If you develop a headache or become dizzy or nauseous, get out at once and cool off under the shower. Get medical help if the symptoms persist.

After having cleaned the tub from all installation debris and dirt, fill the water at normal bathing water level ie. maximum 2" below the overflow when bather is sitting in the tub. Never fill the tub with water above the overflow level.

Installation

WARNING: Refer to Section 680 of National Electrical Code. When using electrical products, basic precautions should always be followed, including the following:


- 1. DANGER: RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK. Connect only to a circuit protected by a ground-fault circuit-interrupter.



Assembly

- Step 1. Flush all water supply lines of debris.
- Step 2. Remove all access panels.
- Step 3. Attach grab bar.
- Step 4. Attach valve and handheld shower.
- Step 5. Place unit where it is to be installed.
- Step 6. Screw in center support legs.
- Step 7. Level unit by adjusting (4) corner legs.
- Step 8. Screw out center support legs.
- Step 9. Connect drain.
- Step 10. Connect water.
- Step 11. Connect power.
- Step 12. Turn on water to inspect water connections.
- Step 13. Fill the unit with approximately 8" of water.
- **Step 14.** Verify drain plunger opens and closes freely. Adjust if necessary and tighten stem lock nut (see picture).
- Step 15. Fill the unit to top of seat level.
- Step 16. Repeat step 15.
- Step 17. Fill the unit with water above the jets.
- Step 18. Repeat step 1 5.
- Step 19. Energize jetting system, inspect jet connections.
- Step 20. Drain the unit.
- Step 21. Inspect drain connections.
- Step 22. Install access panels if necessary.
- Step 23. Give owner's manual and warranty registration to owner.

Note:

This is the full assembly method. Walk-In Baths sold in Europe have many parts pre-assembled, such as the grab bar. Follow the assembly points as your Walk-In Bath requires.

Control Panel Operating Instructions

1. On\Off

Press to activate controls, backlit LED white light will come on; all hydrotherapy options can now be used. Selecting an option changes back light from white to blue to show the function is now active.



2. Chroma Therapy

This button activates the chroma therapy light.

1st Press - Turns on the chroma therapy for duration of 20 min.

2nd Press: Stops cycling through the colors so light stays on the selected color.

3rd Press: Turns off the chroma therapy light

When in cycling mode each color changes after 8 sec.

3. Seat Warmer

This button activates the seat warmer.

1st Press - Turns on the seat warmer for a duration of 20 min. 2nd Press: Turns off the seat warmer.

4. Micro Bubbles

This button activates the micro bubbles.

1st Press - Turns on the micro bubbles for duration of 20 min.

2nd Press: Turns off the micro bubbles.

5. Water Jets

Whirlpool water jets, press to turn on, press again to turn off. Note that water level in tub must exceed sensor located above the top jets in order for whirlpoop jets to activate.

6. Purge & Sterilization Functions

Once the control panel is shut off whether by the 60 minute master timer shutting off by default or by the user turning it off, the Ozone timer is set to come on 1 hr after for a duration of 15 minutes to sterilize the water plum line. The ozonator will only turn on if the tub is empty and the sensor dose not detect water.

7. Other Safety Features

Turning on the water jets on the 1st press resets the 20 minute timer for the Chroma & Seat Warmer. There are 2 thermal switches inside each seat heat pad that shut it off should the temperature meet or exceed 113 degrees Fahrenheit (45 C).

Troubleshooting

Troubleshooting - Micro Bubbles

Always switch off power before servicing.

Blower fails to operate:

- 1. Verify that electronic touch control is connected properly (refer to wiring diagram).
- 2. Check electric power supply Reset circuit breaker or replace fuse if necessary.
- 3. Check ground fault circuit interrupter. Reset if tripped.
- 4. If the system has been functioning for quite some time, it is possible that the thermic protection has shut off the motor. Let it cool off for at least 30 minutes before using it again.

Motor runs, but no bubbles comes through the outlet:

1. Verify that the main air hose from manifold to blower is properly connected. If necessary, reconnect and tighten clamps.

Air inlets of heads are obstructed:

1. If the air outlets of a jet head are obstructed by soap or other residues, fill tub with warm water, then switch system ON and OFF several times. The air outlets should be cleared, if this is not sufficient, carefully tap on the jet heads with the handle of a screw driver or a similar tool (plastic) while the blower is running.

Note: The water bubbles bursting on the surface heat your bath water so there is no need for this system to use an additional water heater **The drying cycle**:

1. Verify with our electronic control instructions.

Troubleshooting - Water Jetting

Always switch off power before servicing.

The electronic control fails to operate:

- 1. Verify electric power supply Reset circuit or replace fuse if necessary.
- 2. Verify all electrical connections (including keypad connection).
- 3. Verify that the Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (G.F.C.I.) has not tripped.
- 4. If the system has been functioning for quite some time, it is possible that the thermal protection has shut off the motor. It is programmed to switch off the system and to wait for at least 30 minutes before using it again. Verify that air is flowing through all jets. If not, cover the jets with warm water, then switch system ON and OFF several times. The air outlets should be cleared. If this is not sufficient, carefully knock on the jet heads with the handle of a screwdriver or similar tool (plastic), while the blower is running.

The blower or pump never stops:

- 1. Verify that the blower is well connected to the control box.
- 2. Verify the keypad connection.
- 3. Verify that there is no water reaching the electrical components under your bathtub.

The electronic control fails to operate:

1. Verify the keypad connection.

The gap between the jamb and the door is non-uniform	A. A slight change in the products shape due to being in transit as changed the alignment.	The door is attached via 6 screws in the hinges, remove the screws using a 5mm Allen (Hex) key. Add or Removes 8mm washers in between the hinges to Re-Align the door.
